From the Vice-Chancellor

This issue of Azhagu reports on the celebrations of National Education Day held on 11.11.2016 at the University; and it made us reflect on the exponential growth of Higher Education in the independent India in terms of key dimensions of development. A quick glance at the quantitative development will show the magnitude of its expansion. The number of universities in India has a marvelous growth. Numerically, it rose to a surprising figure i.e. from 25 in 1950 to 544 in 2010 and 777 in 2016. Equally, the number of colleges registered a growth from 700 to 45,680 in 2016. Student enrollment increased from just 4 lakhs to 296 lakhs and the faculty strength saw an increase from 15,000 in 1950 to 6,99,000 in 2016.

This statistics proves that next to China and USA ours is one of the largest educational systems among the developed nations. It will be appropriate here to state that Alagappa University, established by a Special Act in 1985, stands as a classic example of inclusive rural higher education catering to the immediate needs of students hailing from the economically and educationally backward Sivagangai and Ramanathapuram Districts of Tamil Nadu. The University offers 265 programmes of study through regular, affiliated, distance and collaborative modes. The student-strength of Alagappa University has risen steadily to 1.05 lakhs. The major issues of access and equity are meaningfully addressed to by Alagappa University.

Among the days to be cherished are the Constitution Day and the Children's Day celebrated on a grand scale in our university. The birth anniversary of Dr. Ambedkar, the Father of the Indian Constitution, marked a grand occasion to recall the remarkable contributions of this much-lauded legal luminary to the nation. With absolute involvement and unremitting dedication he framed the Constitution of India. Paying handsomer compliments to the genius of Ambedkar, they referred to the vibrancy of the Indian Constitution which has incorporated all the noteworthy features of other democracies in the world. The Children's Day celebrations afforded an opportunity to remember the never-to-be-forgotten services of Shri Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the Architect of Modern India. In no small measure we are indebted to the great leaders of our nation and we resolve ourselves to uphold the principles they valued.

DEPT OF ENGLISH AND FOREIGN LANGUAGES

Prof. K. Chellappan Endowment Lecture



On 07.11.2016 the Department of English and Foreign Languages, Alagappa University, organized Prof. K. Chellappan Endowment Lecture Programme at the University Seminar Hall.

The Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University Prof. Dr S. Subbiah, who presided over the programme, appreciated the efforts of Department of English and Foreign Languages in holding various Guest and Special lecture programmes and helping the students to imbibe the ray of knowledge about the main literary trends from the luminaries representing various areas of research. He spoke of his interest in the twentieth century English literature, especially poetry of complexity, subtlety and allusiveness involving a deeper figurative meaning different from the surface meaning. He also expressed his exceptional love of T.S. Eliot's poems exploring the meanings of barren spiritual life and the chaotic physical life of the post-war Europe in an atmosphere surcharged with immense erudition and dislocated language.

Prof. S. Bharadwaj, Professor (Retired), from Annamalai University, in his coruscating lecture gave a detailed account of the twentieth century poetry, from the Georgian to the poetry of Dylan Thomas. He insisted that the readers, aiming at enjoyment of reading poetry, should divert their attention from the poet to poem. He commended the Textual and Derridean approaches to examine



and understand modern poetry. To him, a poem is an independent object and it survives by itself free from any externalia; it is to be tested not according to its subject matter which does not share this objectivity, but by its formal qualities. What makes a poem good is the structure created out of texture, the fusion of heterogenous experiences, the like with the unlike. He underlined the various aspects of language used as modern poetic strategies to project the new emerging reality in an effective manner which has resembled that of the Metaphysical poets and resulted in enriching the modern poetic tradition. In this context, he analysed the poems of the major poets such as T.S. Eliot, W.B. Yeats and W.H.Auden. By interpreting Easter 1916, Sailing to Byzantium and The Waste Land, he underscored the play of paradox and irony, the mythical method and poetic images, the historical symbols and individual myths as the single distinctive poetic features of the 20th century British poetry.

Earlier Dr. P. Madhan, Associate Professor and Head i/c, delivered the welcome address and at the end of the programme, Dr. S. Valliammai, Assistant Professor, proposed a vote of thanks.

Lecture Programme on 'Some Notions about Post-Modernism'

The Department of English and Foreign Languages arranged a special lecture programme on 02.11.2016. Prof. Vinod Balakrishnan, Professor, National Institute of Technology, Tiruchirapalli in his scintillating lecture on 'Some Notions about Post-Modernism' gave a detailed portrayal of post-modernism and its impact on the reader's mind.



He said that it is too difficult to comprehend the works of post modernism and at the same time he illustrated the importance of it. He emphasized that post modern writing is the simulacra copy of past and he exposed it through Picaso's 'les demoiselles d'avignan'- painting, Sandra Botticelli's 'The Birth of Venus', Ericfischl's 'The Old Man and the Old Man's Dog', 50- year old Shanghai Tower, Constantinople, Heagra Sophia, -a 400-year old church and with references to John Cage's musical composition 4.33 (1952). He explained that post modernism is an exact copy of reality, so when we read post-modernist works, we must follow the text with its multidimensional perspectives. He showed many paintings and pictures that exposed the plight of women in the Renaissance Period. The regeneration and re-creation of past played a significant role in postmodernism. He also pointed out the vitality of James Joyce, Philip Roth and the Nobel prize awardee Bob Dylan in his thought provoking lecture. Dr.P.Madhan, Associate Professor and Head i/c, Department of English and Foreign languages delivered the welcome address and Dr.M.Natarajan, Assistant Professor, proposed a vote of thanks.

Special Address on Indian Constitution

Dr. K. During his lecture he gave a good demonstration of a science experiment. His lecture was a source of inspiration to the staff and students. Ph.D scholars of the department found the lecture very useful. He was honoured with a shawl by Dr.G.Kalaiyaranan , Head of the Department.

National Education Day



The National Education Day was celebrated at Alagappa University, Karaikudi, jointly by the Department of Education and Alagappa University College of Education, on 11.11.2016 at the University Convocation Seminar Hall.

Presiding over the function, Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, paid handsomer compliments to the first Education Minister of independent India Dr. Maulana Abdul Kalam Azad. He called him the visionary who had woven the fabric of a secular, modern and systematic education in India. At the time of independence, there were 20 Universities and merely 500 colleges with a student-strength of 50,000. But today, it has risen to a spurt of 769 universities and 39,000 colleges catering to the needs of 2 crore- student-population. He added that it is an enormous increase in higher education. The gross enrolment ratio in Britain is 59%, in USA it is 34%, in Japan it is 55% and in China it is 28% but the Indian average is 22%. Interestingly, it is 42% in Tamil Nadu. The Government of Tamil Nadu has been contributing to the growth in this sector by providing quality education and also by strengthening the educational institutions.

He further added that India has always evinced a keen interest to keep the country as a knowledge super power on the educational map of the world. It may be recalled here that in the 5th century A.D., Nalanda University had 2000 Professors for a student-strength of 10,000 with a ratio of 1:5; and it had attracted students as far as Korea, Thailand, Japan, China and other neighbouring countries. He was proud to state that India has been offering value-embedded education. The purpose of education, he added, is not simply to gain knowledge and get jobs, but to evince real societal interest and to develop helping tendency.

Prof. R. Karpagakumaravel, Former Vice-Chancellor of Madurai Kamaraj University and currently, Professor and Head, Department of Education, Central University, Thiruvavur, in his Special Address, said that organizing this function



is not a mere ritual but to bestow serious thoughts on new roles and responsibilities of educators and educational administrators in the New Education Policy of 2016. He stated that the first National Policy on Education was propounded by the Kothari Commission on Education and the second National Policy was introduced in 1986 and that was a landmark in the history of higher education in India which laid emphasis on training programmes such as Orientation Programmes, Refresher Courses, In-Service Training and it also made mandatory for teacher recruits to have qualifications like a pass in NET and SLET Examinations and laid great thrust on research. The District Institute for Education and Training (DIET) was also introduced for training school teachers. He asked the planners to ponder over whether a single body like the UGC would be enough to manage a higher education system with a vast and diversified group of higher educational institutions in India. In a vast country like ours with a complex educational system, there is no greater coordination among the various agencies connected with educational administration.

While a single University in the USA like Chicago University could produce 85 Nobel Laureates, it was a pity that India with strength of 733 Universities could not produce Nobel Laureates. He attributed the success of the Chicago University to its work culture and research environment. He exhorted the Indian teachers to have a clear goal and work with missionary zeal, great involvement and commitment to achieve that goal. He noted that Alagappa University has been a Mecca or a Jerusalem or a Benaras for educational research all along and hoped that it is sure to become a University with

Potential for Excellence very soon. He asked the academicians to give serious thought and offer valuable suggestions to the current National Policy on Education, which is hotly debated today throughout the country.

Dr. P. Sivakumar, Dean, Faculty of Education, offered felicitations. Teachers from various faculties and students numbering about 300 participated in the function.

The celebration began with a rally taken out by the B.Ed. and M.Ed. students. Prof. V. Balachandran, Registrar i/c., flagged off the rally.

Earlier, Prof. G. Kalaiyaran, Professor and Head i/c., Department of Education, welcomed the gathering. Dr. A. Balu, Principal i/c., Alagappa University College of Education, proposed a vote of thanks.

International Day for Elimination of Violence against Women

The International Day for Elimination of Violence against Women was held at Alagappa University on 25.11.2016. Presiding over the function Prof.V.Balachandran, Registrar i/c, said that it was painful to note that once in every three minutes a



crime against women is committed in the country. According to National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) the reported incidents of crime against women has increased from 1,95,856 in 2008 to 3,27,394 in September 2016. On an average it has increased by 67%. Hence, it becomes imperative on the part of the parents and teachers to create awareness by inculcating values in the minds of children. The existing gender inequality contributed to the cause of violence and this could be overcome by a change of perception of the society towards women.



In her keynote address Mrs.S.Mahalakshmi, Principal District Munsif-cum-Judicial Magistrate, Karaikudi, stated that the widening gap between parents and children is the root cause for all sorts of violence. She regretted that most of the parents fail to imbibe moral values in their children. She stressed that women should develop courage, confidence, tolerance and sacrifice to face challenges in their day-to-day life. While explaining the Constitutional provisions for the protection of women, she highlighted the nuances of Domestic Violence Act 2005 and Hindu Widows Re-marriage Act.

Mrs. R. Senthamizh Selvi, a Senior Advocate from Karaikudi, in her special address, pointed out that the Government of India has enacted a number



of laws to safeguard the welfare of women; and women students should be aware of them. As the misuse and abuse of mobile phones led to several cybercrimes, she exhorted the women students to avoid communicating with strangers through social media. Quoting profusely from practical Legal Cases that came for hearing, she said how simple reasons lead to divorces and the consequent sufferings of women at a later period.



Dr. K. Gurunathan, Syndicate Member of the Alagappa University offered felicitation. A placement brochure brought out by the Dept. of Bank Management was released by the Registrar Prof. V. Balachandran and the first copy was received by Judicial Magistrate Mrs.S.Mahalakshmi. Dr.G.Jayabal, Professor and Head, Dept. of Bank Management, welcomed the gathering.
